

# Empty Nester's Tour of Gibbs Gardens Daffodil Fest!

Gibbs Gardens 7th Annual Daffodil ColorFest bursts on the scene when more than 50 acres of blooming daffodils create a feast for the senses—beginning in March and continuing through mid-April. Gibbs Gardens has the distinction of being recognized as an American Daffodil Society Display Garden, one of only 25 in the U.S. Over 20 million + blooms, including 100 different varieties, is what **Southern Living** calls “the most spectacular display of blooms this side of Holland.”

### **Accessibility Information:**

Jim Gibbs wants every Gibbs Gardens' visitor to enjoy a wonderful experience. Gibbs Gardens has handicapped parking near the garden entrance. The Valley Gardens are wheelchair accessible. The Welcome Center (ticketing, restrooms and The Seasons gift store) and the Arbor Café are also wheelchair accessible.

The paths in our Valley Gardens are easy to traverse; they are quite level and wide. There are many benches—126 in the Valley Gardens alone—to provide a comfortable place to sit and rest or just time to relax and take in the beauty of the gardens.

The paths are covered with a ground granite composition that stays firm in dry weather. However, it may soften following rain. As such, visitors who must traverse the Gardens either by wheelchair or electric scooter should call the Gardens on the day of their visit to see if our Pathway Restriction, which prohibits the use of wheelchairs or electric scooters on our pathways, is in place.

### **Tram information:**

- The trams operate daily, Tuesday through Sunday, 10 a.m. to 4 p.m.
- During our Daffodil season, March 1 to approximately mid-April, our trams only run to our Daffodil Gardens.
- There is no tram service to the Japanese Gardens or the Manor House.
- An all-day tram pass is \$5.00 per person, plus tax, which allows a guest unlimited access to tram service during the day of their visit.
