The 500th Anniversary of the Reformation Has Begun!

On October 31, 1517, Augustinian monk Martin Luther posted his "Ninety-five Theses" to the door of the Castle Church in Wittenberg, Germany. Through this document, which protested the sale of indulgences by the Catholic Church, Luther hoped to spur renewal within the church. However, his action had more wide-ranging consequences than he could have imagined at the time. The debate that Luther's theses generated about Christian teaching and practice led to changes that shaped the course of western Christianity. Luther's actions were so important that October 31, 1517, is now used by historians to mark the beginning of the Protestant Reformation.

Five centuries have now passed, and Christians around the world will be commemorating the 500th anniversary of the Reformation in 2017. The ELCA is observing this event under the theme "Freed and Renewed in Christ: 500 Years of God's Grace in Action."

Good Shepherd will be participating in this commemoration throughout 2017, and you will see a wide variety of activities and events during the year, including learning and worship opportunities. We will be learning not only about the history of the Reformation but also how it has shaped—and continues to shape—our faith and our lives.

Blessings and Prayers for Use in the Home

Martin Luther's Small Catechism includes blessings for morning, evening, and around the household meal. As part of the ELCA's observance of the 500th anniversary of the Reformation, these prayers have been updated with today's Christians in mind and in some cases are designed for particular situations, such as the beginning of the work day or school day and a table blessing for those who eat alone.

In the literature rack in the narthex at Good Shepherd you will find copies of these prayers, titled "Blessings and Prayers Based on Those in Luther's Small Catechism." We encourage you to use these prayers in your daily life as a part of your observance of the Reformation—and in the years to come.

History in the Making...

Ecumenical Unity News During the Year of the Reformation

2017 is the 500th anniversary of the Reformation. The commemoration has already begun in the global arena. In case you missed it, a recent historical event was held on October 31, 2016, where leaders of Lutheran World Federation and the Catholic Church held a joint commemoration of the Reformation in Lund, Sweden, under the theme From Conflict to Communion - Together in Hope.

The "Common Prayer" service held in Sweden was presided by LWF President Bishop Dr Munib A. Younan, LWF General Secretary Rev Dr. Martin Junge, and Rev. Pope Francis. The service and information about it can be found at the following internet links....

The video is approximately two hours long, and a hard copy of the service can be found in the church entryway.

During this historical service five Catholic-Lutheran commitments were signed by both the Pope and the Lutheran ministers:

- I. Catholics and Lutheran should always begin from the perspective of unity and not from the point of view of division in order to strengthen what is held in common even though the differences are more easily seen and experienced.
- 2. Lutherans and Catholics must let themselves continuously be transformed by the encounter with the other and by the mutual witness of faith
- 3. Catholics and Lutherans should again commit themsleves to seek visible unity, to elaborate together what this means in concrete steps, and to strive repeatedly toward this good.
- 4. Lutherans and Catholics should jointly rediscover the power of the gospel of Jesus Christ for our time.
- 5. Catholics and Lutherans should witness together to the mercy of God in proclamation and service to the world.

Council Update, December 2016

Discussions

- Financial Secretary, Mike Angalet, reported that November giving was approximately 109% of budget. To date, we are \$52,000 behind budget.
- Appointed Treasurer, Mary McCoy reported that expenses were approximately \$31,000 favorable to budget, largely due to the vacant Associate Pastor postion. Reserves are moving in the right direction, however, still not at recommended levels.
- 2017 Council Officer elections were held, see results on page seven. Council is actively moving to appoint a Treasurer as no current members of council feel qualified to serve in this capacity. Mary McCoy will continue to serve as Treasurer until someone is appointed.
- Council Committee Liaisons were also assigned, and are listed on page seven.

Happy New Year! What a fantastic year of giving and serving we had at Good Shepherd during 2016. I am constantly amazed at the wonderful generosity of our congregation and can't wait to see what 2017 brings. I realize sometimes that our impact on the world around us may get lost in the hustle and bustle of everyday

life but let me assure you, with every donation you bring in on any given Sunday and every hour of your time you volunteer, we are spreading God's love and generosity to those around us who need it most. In the last three months of 2016 alone, the congregation of Good Shepherd —

- Delivered five large gift baskets and multiple additional boxes of goodies to five local fire/ rescue/and police precincts in our area to express our gratitude for the hard work and dedication these men and women share every day.
- Raised more than \$1,100 for the ELCA World Hunger Campaign in one Sunday in honor of World Food Day.
- Packed and delivered 125 sack lunches for the child residents of Hidden Falls mobile home park who may otherwise not have lunch during the school break week.
- Provided approximately 165 shoeboxes filled with Christmas goodies to the LSG Christmas Shoebox Campaign so that relocated refugee children can experience the thrill of their first Christmas in America.
- Raised more than \$367 in just four short Sundays through the sale of Gift Cards that will help us expand our Outreach ministry in 2017.

But probably one of the greatest impacts we had during the holidays was the one that benefitted MUST Ministries. This Thanksgiving season MUST had a total budget of \$1,700 donated funds to purchase turkeys for as many needy families in the area as possible. Thanks to donations from our congregation and Thrivent Action Team money provided by member, Pete Dumpis, Good Shepherd was responsible for providing 28% of the total donated funds. That means we provided a turkey to one out of every four families MUST Ministries reached this Thanksgiving! We also donated 67 cans of cranberries and 74 cans of yams. This is a great testament to what we at Good Shepherd can do collectively as well as just how much more we can do when we take advantage of Thrivent's Action Team Program.

Good Shepherd has always been a very generous and giving church that responds greatly to the needs of our community and for this, I thank you all immensely. As we turn our attention to 2017, I can assure you there will be several more opportunities to make a difference in our community and spread God's love. With the help of the Outreach Advisory Panel, we are currently finalizing plans for a few different avenues of accomplishing these goals and are very excited about the possibilities 2017 holds. I look forward to serving with each and every one of you in the new year to come.


The Personnel Committee is currently preparing a job description for the position to present to the Council in January with recommendations for how that position might best be staffed. The congregation will receive another update in January.

God's Grace in Action — News from the Stewardship Committee

The Stewardship Committee will be conducting our God's Grace in Action with Offerings pledge campaign in January. Your offering pledge will support the Good Shepherd fiscal year 2018 budget which begins July 1st, 2017 and runs through June 30th, 2018. While church stewardship includes our Service - time and talents, it also takes our Offerings - money, to operate the church facility

- our church home, just like it does our own home. There are utilities and staff to pay, there are unexpected expenses and repairs – just like in our own home. It takes money to fulfill the ministry we have from God.

The Finance Committee will begin meeting in February to develop the new budget for FY 2018. It is extremely important to return your offerings pledge card by the end of January – January 29 - so the Finance Committee has a complete offerings projection with which to develop an accurate and balanced budget for next year.

The pledge you make will be for one amount and will include your annual pledge, **plus** your November Youth Ministry pledge, and any increase you may wish to make. The offerings pledge cards will be handed out on two Sundays in January - the 8th and the 15th. Please take time during this month to consider what level of financial commitment you can make to **your** church home.

If you have not already, please consider signing up for Simply Giving, the automated way to submit your offerings. With Simply Giving, the church can count on a consistent level of offerings which makes planning and paying our expenses much easier. Simply Giving forms are available in the entry way.
