

## Revelation Lesson Plan

Have you ever heard of the book of Revelation?

What is a revelation? (Read the first 2 paragraphs of “What’s the Story?” in your Lutheran Study Bible on page 2026)

- A revelation is an unveiling or revealing of something that was previously hidden.
- Revelations in the Bible are filled with striking, fantastic images of conflict between good and evil and end in a glorious triumph of God.

What have you heard?

Read Revelation 1:1-11 and answer the following questions

- Who is the Author of Revelation?
- Who is he writing to? (Locate these churches on the map on page 2028)
- Where is he writing from?
- Why is he there?
- What is he writing about?
- What are the blessings for those who keep the Revelation?

What is the message of Revelation? (Read “What’s the Message?” in the Lutheran Study Bible on page 2027.)

- A warning to those who are falling away from the faith (Jesus had promised to return, but it hasn't happened yet so it was very hard to keep believing and to stand up to persecution)
- An encouragement to those who were oppressed, persecuted, or feeling powerless in a hostile world
