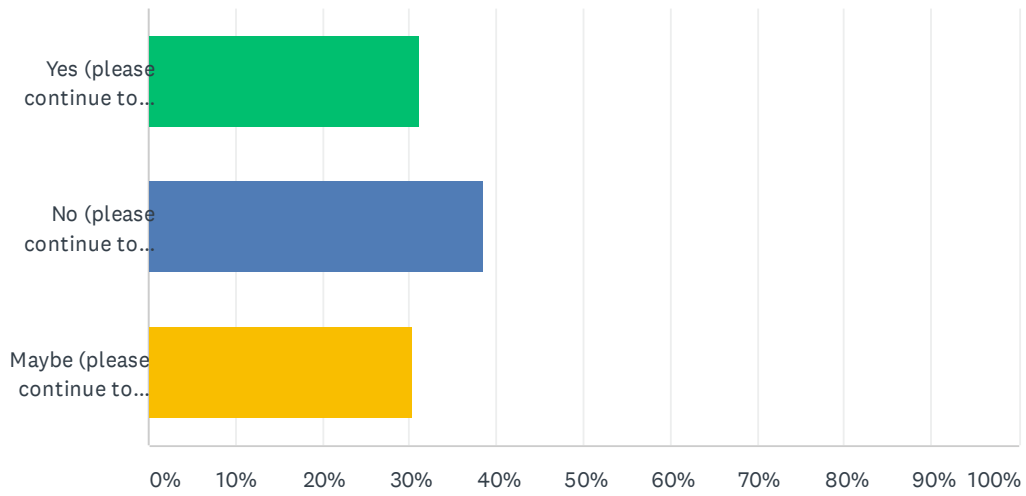


Q1 After watching the training video, would you register and join us for a similar worship experience, Sunday mornings at 9 a.m.?

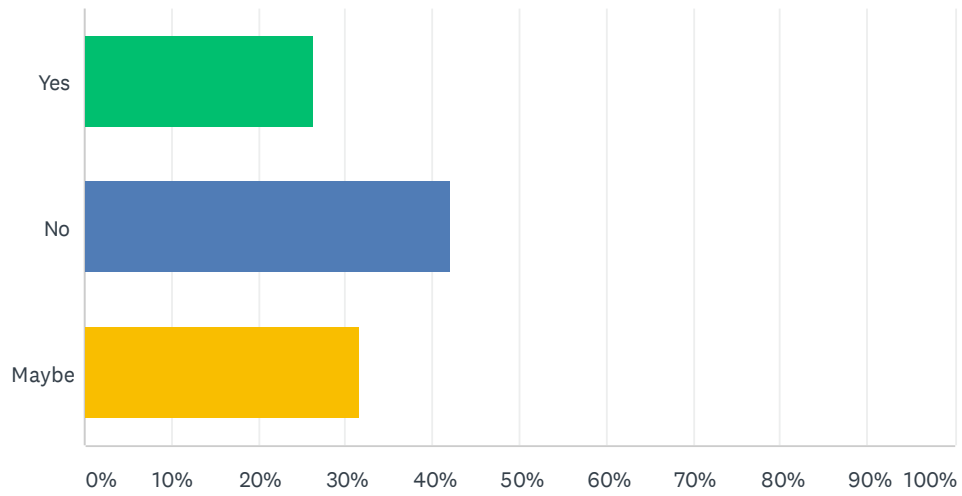
