Please be patient with us through this initial process. We are excited to begin to safely return to worship, but it will take time and patience from all as we learn what it takes to make worship feel as normal as possible, for as many members as safely possible. Thank you.

Dear brothers and sisters in Christ,

In March, council approved a subgroup of the 2020 COVID Task Force (CTF) to research updates to the CDC guidelines toward re-opening for in-person worship. In consideration of CDC guidances that relaxed previous concerns of modes of transmission (surface contact) coupled with downward trends in new cases and percent positivity, the task force has recommended and the council approved Phase II reopening for in-person worship at Good Shepherd. Though trends and percent positivity in Cherokee county have not been ideal, weighing the balance of the needs and desires to worship in-person against those numbers supports this decision and we are excitedly planning for in-person worship starting on May 2<sup>nd</sup>. Though much discussion, careful consideration, and planning has gone into this effort, please know that the initial goal is to get us “back together” as soon as possible and procedures and policies are expected to modify as we go along and get more comfortable with this new approach to in-person worship. The task force has updated the *CTF Recommendations for Reopening* document released last year with current considerations for Worship & Music, Facilities & Maintenance, and staff and high point bullets are as follows:

Resume two services, 8:30 AM and 10:45 AM on May 2<sup>nd</sup>

- 50-individuals per service (this includes Sunday Servants, Pastor, and musicians)
- Pre-registration will be required and communicated via e-mail
- Masks will be required
- Social distancing will be maintained, though immediate families / COVID families can sit together
- Communion will be conducted using the pre-packaged “packets” currently used at outdoor communion
- To reduce aerosols, singing will be limited to choir and Praise Team
- Bulletins will continue to be provided electronically before each Sunday. We ask that you print your own copy or use on your device
- There is a continuing need for Sunday Servants, though minimizing numbers per service. Sign-ups will be communicated via e-mail.
- Screen projection may also be implemented
- Bathrooms in the admin wing will be accessible, though the rest of the admin wing and the education wing are still restricted.
- Wipes will be made available in each pew. In consideration of others, please quickly wipe down your immediate area before leaving service
- No Fellowship time after service
- No childcare initially
- Services will be recorded and posted on our website for individuals not able to attend in-person worship
- Outdoor communion will be available between services for individuals not able to attend in-person worship

This is a very exciting time for our congregation and the success of these efforts will continue to depend on your willingness to volunteer as Sunday Servants, cooperation and consideration of others during these initial phases of re-opening. The council very much wants to thank the CTF and staff for their tireless work, efforts and meeting after meeting in discernment and planning. Good Shepherd Lutheran Church continues to be blessed with opportunities. I pray for the Holy Spirit to continue to guide us and I look forward to seeing you soon.

In addition, we will be adding two additional donated garden beds which will increase our produce output and let us put in some additional types of vegetables. The harvest is brought to different community organizations and served in their food pantries where the need for food has grown tremendously in the past year. Thursday, April 22nd is Earth Day and we will resume collecting used toothbrushes and empty toothpaste containers as well as small batteries (no larger than D) on Sunday, April 25. Two appropriately marked containers will be on the porch during the week for dropping off your items.



Also, check this out! On April 24, from 9 AM to 1 PM, the Greenstock Day Recycling and Paper Shredding Event will take place at Woodstock Elementary. Details on this event can be found at the Woodstock Parks and Recreation [website](#).

Other local recycling options include:

- RECYCLING CENTER at Hobgood Park for glass, aluminum cans, cardboard, and recyclable plastic
- PUBLIX for Styrofoam egg cartons, trays, and fast food holders, think plastic, such as grocery bags, drycleaner bags, and film coverings on food items and paper including advertisements.
- WAL-MART for ink cartridges and plastic bags
- LOWES for compact florescent light bulbs, rechargeable batteries, and plastic bags
- BATTERIES PLUS for incandescent bulbs and non-alkaline batteries (They will recycle other bulbs and batteries for a charge)

## Used Paint Recycling Program

Do you have partially used cans of paint laying around and don't know what to do with them? The Lutheran Coalition for Habitat is working in conjunction with Timothy Lutheran Church and Good Shepherd Lutheran Church, both in Woodstock, to collect used paint to be shipped to third world countries and used to paint homes for those who cannot afford such a luxury. We can accept any latex paint (no stain) as long as the can is at least ¼ full. (Sorry we cannot accept rusted cans.) The paint will be shipped through Global Paint for Charity, to countries around the world. This will help families with the beauty and longevity of their home as well as improve sanitary conditions. All you need to do is bring your paint to either Timothy Lutheran Church at 556 Arnold Mill Road or Good Shepherd Lutheran Church at 1208 Rose Creek Drive on May 8<sup>th</sup> between 9am and 3pm. (enter on Eagle Drive only.) There is a recommended donation of \$5.00 per can of which the proceeds will go towards building a new Habitat for Humanity house in Cherokee County next year.
