This week's Favorite hymn or song, "Amazing Grace", was selected by Patricia Mote and "Speaks to faith and forgiveness".

The text for this hymn was originally penned by John Newton in 1772, while he was a curate in Olney England. This was published in a 1779 in a collection titled 'Olney Hymns.' Only the lyrics were published, so the tune that was originally used is unknown. Newton began his career as a sailor on slave ships, after a severe storm at sea that was nearly fatal for him, he began a slow conversion to Christianity, later becoming an abolitionist and minister. Many movies and books have been published on his extraordinary life.

The familiar tune that we now know and love, 'New Britain,' was first published with the 'Amazing Grace' text in 1847 by William Walker, in his tunebook, 'Southern Harmony.' The 5th verse in our ELW hymnal was first published in Harriet Beecher Stowe's 1852 novel, 'Uncle Tom's Cabin'.
