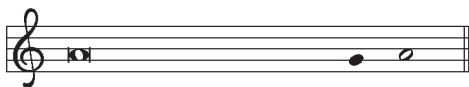

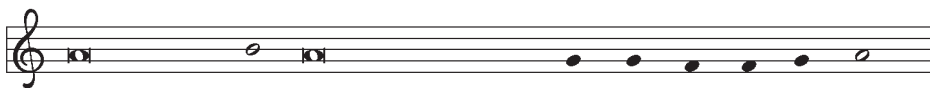



Chapters: Drinking Tea (Chapter 10) and Sleep (Chapter 11)
